

Winter is Here Wall Hanging

(Foundation Paper Pieced)




Approx. size of wall hanging 8" by 19"

Please note there are no fabric requirements included in this pattern. It is an ideal project to use up scraps. We would however suggest you use the same blue sky choice for each of the 4 mini blocks.

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"Winter is Here"



Finished size: 19" x 8"
Block size: 4" x 5"
Border 1: ½" wide
Border 2: 1" wide

CONSTRUCTING THE BLOCKS

1. Using the patterns enclosed, follow the symbols to complete the foundation piecing.

2. Big & Little Trees Block. Join together units A and B making sure that the little tree is on the left hand side of the big tree when viewed from the right side.

3. Old Country Church Block. Join Unit A to Unit D making sure that Unit D with the door is on the right hand side when viewed from the right side. Join Unit C to AD. Join Unit E to one side of ACD and Unit G to the other. Join Unit F to the bottom of ACDEG. Join Unit B to the top of ACDEFG.

JOINING THE BLOCKS

- 1. Layout the completed blocks according to the design above.
- Join together.
- 3. Remove foundation papers from seam allowances and press open.

BORDERS

Border 1

- 1. Cut two strips 16 ½" x 1" wide and two strips 6 ½" x 1" wide.
- Using a ¼" seam allowance, stitch the two longer strips to the top and bottom edges of the wall hanging.
- 3. Press seam allowances towards the border.
- 4. Stitch the remaining two short strips to the side edges of the wall hanging.
- Press seam allowances towards the border.
- 6. Remove remaining foundation papers.

Border 2

- 1. Cut two strips 17 ½" x 1 ½" wide and two strips 6 ½" x 1 ½" wide.
- 2. From contrasting fabric cut four 1 1/2" squares for the cornerstone blocks.
- 3. Using a ¼" seam allowance, stitch the two longer strips to the top and bottom edges of the wall hanging.
- 4. Press seam allowances towards this border.

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5. Stitch 1 cornerstone block to either end of the remaining two short strips.

- 6. Press seam allowances away from the blocks.
- 7. Stitch these strips to the side edges of the wall hanging.
- Press seam allowances towards the border.

QUILTING


- 1. Layer quilt top with wadding and backing.
- 2. Machine quilt "in-the-ditch" around the trees, the church and the seams of both borders. Further quilting "in-the-ditch" may be added around the larger tree sections, windows, door and roof of the church, etc. if desired.

BINDING AND FINISHING

The fabric requirements for the binding allow for the double-fold method using strips cut to a width of $2 \frac{1}{4}$ ".

Attach a hanging sleeve as desired.

Embellish with buttons, beads, etc. if required.




Key:


▲ = sky


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
▲ = sky
