Class Description:

This is 'tumbling blocks' with a difference. Make it look three dimensional by using light, medium and dark shades. It is Foundation Paper Pieced and in the class you will make one of the blocks. You will be provided with patterns for the second block. If you want to make the whole quilt you can book this class and then book on one of Sue's Open Format classes.

Fabric Requirements:

- Scraps, Fat 1/8^{ths} or Fat Quarters of light, medium and dark fabrics – at least two of each.

If you plan on making the full quilt please see the following page.

Equipment:

- Sewing machine (don't forget foot pedal, power lead and accessories e.g. feet, bobbins, needles plus your manual).
- Standard and 1/4" foot for your sewing machine
- Rotary cutter, cutting mat & acrylic 6" by 24" ruler
- An "Add-A-Quarter" ruler
- Neutral sewing thread for piecing
- Basic sewing kit (scissors, hand needles, thread snips, unpicker, pins, etc)
- Marking pen or chalk pen
- Notepad and pen (ideally a propelling pencil)

Please remember:

- To wear a face covering / mask or face shield when moving around the classroom & in the shop.
- That the windows will be kept open during the class to allow for adequate ventilation.

To bring your own equipment where possible (including a travel mug if you have one).



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For making the full quilt:

- 1.5m background fabric that will contrast well with the cube fabrics
- A selection of fabrics for the cubes that include at least 6 of each of light, medium and dark. Choose either one colour e.g. blue (and use as many shades of blue as you can) or use different colours for each face of the cubes e.g. light blues for tops, medium greens for the front and dark purples for the side.

These fabrics can be a fat quarter or less. This is a good way to use up leftovers from previous projects. Small to medium print sizes are best.

- Glue stick and "magic" tape or cello tape.
- Foundation paper piecing equipment (Add-A-Quarter ruler, stiff card and flower head pins or what ever is your preference for FPP). Don't worry if you haven't got these – we can improvise!
- Spray starch or Best Press.
