

# Hang a Stocking for Santa



Approx. finished size: 17" by 20"

#### **Fabrics requirements:**

Stockings: 9 small pieces approx 3" x 2" each Background: 9 rectangles cut 3.5" x 4.5"

Sashing: 12 pieces cut 1.5" x 3.5" and 4 pieces cut 1.5" x 16" Border: 2 pieces cut 2.5" x 13.5" AND 2 pieces 2.5" x 19.5"

## **Workshop Notes**

It is assumed that an accurate ¼" seam allowance is used throughout.


Note: if you don't sew with this, you may need to adjust the length of the border pieces to suit your project.

## Background:

Lay out the background pieces - 3 across x 3 down
Add the small pieces of sashing above each piece
Sew 3 together vertically – repeat twice so that you have 3 vertical rows.
Press the seams.

Add vertical sashing between the rows and then add to the outside edges. Press seams. Add borders: top and bottom first, then press and then add the sides and press.

## Stockings:



Trace stocking onto the back of the Heat N Bond Lite (or similar)

You will need to cut 9 stockings.

Cut out approximately and iron onto the back of the chosen piece of fabric.

Cut out accurately.

Peel off paper backing and place onto wallhanging; iron into place.

Once all 9 are done, you can embellish as required – these have not been sewn down – but could benefit from the addition of a little button maybe to represent a hanger. Or glitter glue around the stocking shape.

## Layer and quilt

For the quilting you could just stitch across the whole project catching the stockings as you go. Then bind and add a means of hanging it up for a hidden pole or loops.
