

Magic 4 Patch Quilt Workshop Notes



Please note these are basic instructions to accompany a workshop or zoom demo.

- 1. Take 4 fat quarters and cut each into 4 squares as large as you can somewhere between 9" and 10" Or use 10" precut squares
 Or 5" precut squares
 Or ANY other size squares
- 2. Lay out one square of each fat quarter = 1 set Lay out 4 squares
- 3. Sew together into a 4 patch, finger press (don't use an iron!)
- 4. Cut either side of the centre vertical and horizontal seams at a given size: Val suggests 2.5" for 10" squares and 1.5" for 5" squares but any size is fine, the key is that you cut all 4 sides the same!
- 5. Shuffle large squares and then the little 4 patch, this will now resemble a 9-patch. Re-sew this gives you the basic block
- 6. Repeat with the other 3 sets, this creates the medallion centre of the quilt

If you wish to continue with the borders in the top left picture;

The blocks are constructed in the same manner – but the starting point is that the squares are smaller suggest 5" squares. You will need to make 16. Four of these now need to be made the right length as your medallion centre – so add a fudge factor in the way of a strip or two! (the feature border doesn't need to be taken into account when measuring) Repeat with the remaining 12 to make the 4 borders. Decide on the corners – these were created from another piece of fabric but cut the same size as the smaller Magic 4 blocks. Create the borders and add to your medallion centre.

The basic block can be used in a variety of settings: try putting them on point, using just 2 fabrics – the possibilities are endless!

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
