



Crossroads to Jericho



Approx. finished size: 46" by 54"

This is a very simple and easy to make scrap quilt which can use up your scraps or a nickel pack. If you use a nickel pack then you need to use a very accurate and mean $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. For each block you need to make a central 9 patch which has 4 squares of the background chain fabric matched with a small square of the fabric used in the corner triangle.

Fabrics requirements:

1m blue for squares, 1st border and cornerstones

2x 5" squares of each scrap/fabrics that you are using (you will need 40 sets to make a quilt this size) this is for the triangles, small squares and piano key border.

Cutting Instructions (per block)

Needs 5 squares @ 2.5" of the chain fabric

*Take 2 squares at 5" and cut one of them once on the diagonal to give 2 triangles; cut the other in half vertically; put one rectangle aside for later (the piano keys border) and cut the other rectangle in half to give 2 squares at 2.5"

Repeat from * - this gives you enough pieces for your block BUT if you want it more scrappy you need to cut a variety before you move onto the sewing section.

Workshop Notes

Make the 9 patch – out of the 2.5" squares ensuring the chain fabric colour is on the corners and in the middle.



Add the corner triangles across the relevant colour square – take care that they are lined up and that you have the ¼" ear sticking out before you sew.



Make 20 blocks

Set out in a pleasing manner – 4 across x 5 down

Sew into rows and then together

Add borders:

1st Border can be cut 2.5” wide

2nd border was created from piano keys of fabric cut 2.5” x 6” with 6” corner squares of the same colour as the 1st border

Layer, quilt and bind.

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
