



Three Christmas Tree Wall Hanging

(Foundation Paper Pieced)



Approx. size of wall hanging 9" by 21"

This can be made by using up lots of small scraps – an ideal project to raid your stash!

Requirements:

Variety of Christmas fabric scraps for the trees, and small pieces of brown for the tree trunks
Fat 1/8th of background fabric (this could also be scraps)
25cm Border fabric
Foundation paper to trace the designs onto

Workshop Notes

Using your normal foundation paper piecing method make up three trees.
The numbers indicate which order to attach the pieces.

Once all three trees are finished trim them to the edge of the dotted lines
(this is for the seam allowance)

Once the trees have been completed you can turn them into a wall hanging
by adding simple borders.

Cut two 1½" sashing strips the same width as your tree blocks and attach to the top and bottom of the
middle tree. Join the other trees to make a column.

Measure the width and length of your project and cut strips 3" wide to fit.



Sew the two sides first then press.
Attach the top and bottom of the wall hanging.

Layer and quilt, adding embellishments as desired and add a means of hanging it up for a hidden pole or loops when binding the project.
