



Winter or Village Scene

Approx. finished size 51" x 66"



Fabrics requirements:

- Fabric 1** Feature Fabric 1.5m
Fabric 2 & 3 2 contrasting fabrics - Fat $\frac{1}{4}$ of each (used for the 4 patch blocks)
Fabric 4 2 fabrics – 30cm each or 1 fabric - 60cm (used for large horizontal sashing)
Fabric 5 30cm (used for small horizontal contrast sashing)
Fabric 6 narrow vertical sashing – used leftovers from fabric 1
Borders 75cm
Cornerstones These can come from leftovers of other fabrics (fabric 1 in the picture above)

Cutting Instructions:

- Fabric 1** Cut 3 sections approx 29.5" long x 10.5" deep (you should have 1 left over)
Fabric 2 & 3 Cut 6 squares of each cut @ 5.5"
Fabric 4 Cut 4 pieces, if using 2 fabrics 2 of each – cut 5" by the width of your quilt before borders
Fabric 5 Cut 8 pieces cut 1.5" x width of your quilt before borders
Fabric 6 Cut 3 pieces 2.5" x 10.5"
Borders cut 5 pieces 5" wide x WOF
Cornerstones cut 4 @ 5" square

Construction;

1. Take the 6 squares of fabrics 2 and 3 to make 4 patches – you need to make 3, then press them.
2. Add to the sides of the feature fabric strips with the vertical sashing between them – NOTE that the middle section has the 4 patch on the right hand end, the other two sections on the left hand end.
3. Measure*
4. Add horizontal contrast strips (fabric 5) that have been cut at 1.5” wide to the top and the bottom of the horizontal sashing strips (fabric 4) that have been cut 5” wide, make 4 of these. Press seams closed.
5. Trim these strip sets to the same length/measurement as above*
6. Lay sections out so that they look like the picture i.e. sashing strip set first, then village scene section/sashing strip set/ etc
7. Sew together until you have your quilt medallion

Now you need to add the borders;

1. Sew border strips together – you will need a strip and a bit for each of the sides.
2. Measure the sides of the quilt and cut the side borders to this size.
3. Measure across the top of your quilt, cut two border strips to this length, and add on the corner stones.
4. Add the side borders to your quilt top and then add the top and bottom borders to which you have added the cornerstones.

Your quilt top is now finished, and you can layer, quilt and bind it. Happy Sewing!

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
