

# LONG LANDSCAPE

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# Class Description:

Create this lovely long landscape using your own scrap fabrics and add any ribbons, threads, beads and trimmings you may have. Learn how to create small floral textures from scrap fabrics and combine them with french knots, beads, and loose french knots to create a lovely, layered wall hanging. The finished piece is 16cm wide and 50cm high. This could be used as a wall hanging or the centre of a larger item such as a quilt.

## **Material Requirements:**

You will need to bring along:

- At least 7 different fabrics; 1 plain for the sky and 6no. patterned for the land. All 25cm wide by 16cm high.
- Plain fabric scraps for cutting up to use for the flowers.
- In choosing your fabrics, stick to 2 or 3 main colours;
  Vicky used patterned greens and blues with plain pale pinks for the flowers. Pastel colours work very well.
- Backing fabrics: 2no. rectangles 25cm x 60cm. One will be completely covered over, so will not be seen.
- Trimmings, ribbons, beads, lace, wools in colours to suit your design.

### **Equipment:**

- Basic sewing kit: pins, hand embroidery needles, an unpicker, scissors (both large & small sharp ones) etc.
- An embroidery needle (size 3 works well).
- Sewing machine (don't forget foot pedal, power lead and accessories e.g. feet, bobbins, needles plus your manual).
- Normal sewing foot plus a walking foot.
- Hand embroidery threads
- Machine sewing threads for quilting to match your colour range.
- 505 temporary spray adhesive.
- Heat erasable pen.
- Notebook & propelling pencil.
- A standard 30cm ruler.

# Please remember:

- We have 6 sewing machines (Janome M100 QDC) for hire; if you would like to hire one for this class, please do book one in advance – they are available on a first come, first served basis.
- The windows may be opened periodically during the class to allow for adequate ventilation.
- To bring your own equipment where possible (including a travel mug if you have one).
